WHO: Nevada Division of Emergency Management/Homeland Security, Nevada Department of Transportation, Nevada Department of Public Safety and University of Nevada, Reno (Police, Emergency Management and Athletics Department).

WHAT: As part of National Preparedness Month, NDEM and NDOT staff will be on hand before the Wolf Pack vs. Hawaii football game to answer questions, provide educational materials and pass out promotional giveaways for attendees. Several emergency preparedness and self-help brochures will be available including:

September is National Preparedness Month (NPM). Established after 9/11 to increase preparedness in the United States, September is a fitting time for everyone to join the safety effort. Preparedness is a shared responsibility; it takes a whole community.

The national preparedness architecture encompasses prevention, protection, response, and recovery efforts to prepare the United States for all hazards – whether terrorist attack or natural disaster. The Zero Fatalities Safety traffic safety movement focuses on eliminating fatalities on Nevada roadways. WHY: Emergencies can happen anytime and anywhere. Households, businesses and organizations should prepare to be self-reliant for three days without utilities, electricity, or water, without access to supermarkets or local services and even without response from police, fire or rescue. Preparing can start with four important steps: Be informed about emergencies that could happen and identify sources of information in your community that will be helpful before, during and after an emergency. Make a plan for what to do in an emergency. Build an emergency supply kit. Get involved.
